












WOODLEM AWARDS: BEST TEACHER AWARD CRITERIA

The badge remains the child's responsibility, and in case of loss, a replacement will only be issued upon payment.

ATTENDANCE & PUNCTUALITY

Attendance

Woodlem Park Al Hamidiya Private School promotes high levels of attendance and punctuality across the school. There is a clear connection supported by research, between high levels of attendance and achievement.

- Students are expected to attend school every day unless they are unwell. If a student is absent for three or more consecutive days due to illness, a medical certificate must be provided. Without appropriate medical documentation, the absence will be recorded as unauthorised.
- Family holidays should be organised in school holiday time. Time off school for holidays, weddings, birthdays and family celebrations will not be approved.
- Approved leave is granted on a case-by-case basis by the Head of Section, this can only be granted for extenuating circumstances where evidence is provided.
- If a student is absent, email must be sent to the class teachers and the HOS

Failure to meet the expected attendance threshold of 98% will result in a series of escalating interventions. In cases where attendance falls below 75%, and there is no sustained improvement, a student may be required to repeat the academic year in line with our attendance policy.

Punctuality

Students are expected to be in class and ready to learn before the National Anthem, which is played promptly at 7:30 AM. Any student arriving after this time will be marked as late. Persistent lateness will be addressed with parents and, if it continues, escalated to the Senior Leadership Team. In line with school policy, ongoing failure to arrive on time may result in a block on the student's re-enrolment for the next academic year.

Early Leave Release

There may be an occasion where a student needs to leave the school site in the day. The parent must contact <u>info@woodlemparkhamidiya.ae</u> or tel:+97167422999Please note, students cannot be collected for early release after 2:00 PM due to staffing and end of the day duties. Proof of the reason for early leave such as doctors note will be need to be shared with the reception on collection.

Our approach fosters school values, meets individual needs, and builds character, leadership, and resilience. We provide health and wellbeing education, counseling, and external support, while honoring student voices through council representatives and a wellbeing leadership team. STUDENTS BEHAVIOUR EXPECTATIONS

At Woodlem Park Al Hamidiya Private School, we are committed to creating a respectful, supportive, and positive environment where every student feels valued and safe. Our behaviour policy is designed to nurture kindness, responsibility, and fairness, reflecting the school's core values.

We follow a positive and inclusive approach to managing behaviour, focusing on developing self-esteem, self-discipline, and mutual respect. Through restorative practices, students are encouraged to build healthy relationships, take responsibility for their actions, and learn from experiences. Recognition, praise, and encouragement are used consistently to reinforce positive behaviour.

To ensure transparency, clarity, and fairness, behaviour expectations are supported by a structured framework that outlines the Degrees of Offences and their corresponding consequences. These tables, attached in this section, categorize student misbehaviours into levels ranging from minor to severe, with clear disciplinary actions. This helps students understand accountability while ensuring consistency in corrective measures.

By working together — students, staff, and parents — we aim to foster a school community built on cooperation, respect, and responsibility, enabling every learner to thrive academically and personally.



First degree offenses (simple offenses) 4 marks shall be deducted for each offense

Offense No.	Description
1.1	Being repeatedly late to the morning parade or failing to participate therein without an acceptable excuse.
1.2	Failing to attend the classes on time repeatedly without an acceptable excuse.
1.3	Non-compliance with the school uniform or the school sports uniform without an acceptable excuse.
1.4	Overgrown hair for boys or bizarre haircuts for boys and girls.
1.5	Not brining the books and school kits without an acceptable excuse.
1.6	Non-compliance with the positive behavior rules inside and outside the classroom, such as: keeping calm and disciplined during the class time and making inappropriate sounds inside or outside the classroom.
1.7	Sleeping during the class time or formal school activities with no justification (after making sure of the student's health status).
1.8	Eating during the class times or during the morning parade without a justification or permission (after making sure of the student's health status).
1.9	Non -compliance with presenting homework and assignments given to him / her in a timely manner.
1.10	Misuse of the electronic devices such as the tablets etc., during the class, including playing games and using headphones inside the classroom.
1.11	All of what is similar to these offenses as per the discretion of the Behavior Management Committee

Second degree offenses (medium severity offenses) 8 marks shall be deducted for each offense

Offense No.	Description
2.1	Not attending the school without an acceptable excuse at any time, including before
	and after the holidays and ends of weeks and before exams.
2.2	Getting in or out of the classroom during the class time without permission.
2.3	Not attending the school activities and events without an acceptable excuse.
2.4	Inciting quarrel, threatening or intimidating peers in the school.
2.5	Acting in a manner contradicting with the public morals or the public order at the school and with the values and traditions of the society, such as imitating the opposite sex in terms of clothes, appearance, haircuts and use of makeup.
2.6	Writing on the school furniture or school bus seats. Tampering with the alarm bell or the lift.
2.7	Bringing mobile phones or misuse any means of communication.
2.8	Verbally abusing or insulting students, staff, or visitors of the school.
2.9	Smoking or possessing the relevant kits inside the school campus.
2.10	Refusing to respond to the instruction of inspection or to hand over the banned materials.
2.11	All of what is similar to these offenses as per the discretion of the Behavior Management Committee

Ministerial Resolution No.851 of Year 2018 On Code of Behavior Management for Students in the General Education Institutions

Third degree offenses (grievous offenses) 12 marks shall be deducted for each offense

Offense No.	Description
3.1	Various types and forms of bullying.
3.2	Copying or reproducing the assignments, reports, researches or projects and taking credit for them, as per the Form No.23 .
3.3	Getting out of the school without permission or absconding during the school day.
3.4	Attempting to defame peers and the school staff via the social media or abusing them.
3.5	Impersonating others' personality in the school, during transactions, or forging the school documents.
3.6	Destroying or seizing the school furniture, tools, and vandalism
3.7	Tampering with or destroying the school buses. Causing harm to the driver, supervisor, or the other road users.
3.8	Assaulting others in the school, without causing any injuries to the victim (corporal abuse).
3.9	Driving a private car recklessly inside or around the school campus, and not following the security and safety instructions.
3.10	Capturing, possessing, publishing or disseminating photos of the school staff and / or students without their permission.
3.11	All of what is similar to these offenses, as per the discretion of the Behavior Management Committee.

Fourth degree offenses (highly grievous offenses) Failure in the subject

Offense No.	Description
4.1	Using the communication means or social media for unlawful or immoral purposes,
	or in a manner discrediting the educational institution and its staff or others.
4.2	Possessing or using arms or blade weapons, or their equivalent inside the school.
4.3	Committing sexual assault inside the school, the bus or during activities.
4.4	Assaulting others in the school causing injuries to the victim (corporal abuse).
4.5	Systematic (pre-planned) or covering up theft.
4.6	Bringing, possessing, presenting, or promoting information or electronic materials
	that are unauthorized and inconsistent with the values, morals, public order, and
	public decency.
4.7	Sexual harassment inside the school, the bus, or during activities.
4.8	Leaking questions of the exams or engaging therein, in any way.
4.9	Setting the school campus on fire.
4.10	Abusing political, religious, or social figures in UAE.
4.11	Possessing, bringing, promoting, or using narcotics, medical drugs, or the psychotropic substances inside the school or the school bus, or being under the influence of narcotics, non-prescribed medical drugs or the psychotropic substances.
4.12	Disseminating or promoting ideas or beliefs on extremism, blasphemy or atheism, or the ones harming the political and social regulations of the society.
4.13	Disdaining the divinely revealed religions or stirring sectarian strife in the school.
4.14	All of what is similar to these offenses, which are considered as legally punishable offences, as per the discretion of the Behavior Management Committee.

HEALTHY SCHOOL MEALS

At our school, we strongly encourage and value the tradition of parents providing nutritious home-cooked meals for their children, as nothing can replace the warmth and care of food prepared at home. However, we also recognize that today's busy lifestyles sometimes call for convenient alternatives. To support our families, the school has introduced a canteen facility for students.

All food items available in the canteen are carefully selected and approved by the Ministry, ensuring that every option is healthy, hygienic, and suitable for growing children. The menu is handpicked with our students in mind, offering a balance of taste, nutrition, and variety to complement their learning and activity throughout the day.

To maintain discipline and order, students will be permitted to use the canteen only during the designated break times:

First Break: 9:10 – 9:25 AM
Second Break: 12:20 – 12:45 PM



- Meeting minutes will be recorded and circulated within one week.

Roles & Responsibilities

- Preside over meetings and ensure all voices are heard fairly.
- Ensure follow-up actions are tracked and communicated.

School Leadership:

- Address feedback and report progress on forum suggestions.
- Ensure alignment of forum discussions with CBSE and MOE expectations

Guidelines For School Transportation

A. Bus Pickup and Drop-off

B. Drop-off Protocol

• Students will be dropped off at the scheduled time. If a parent is not available to receive the child, the student will be returned to school. Parents will be required to pick up the student from the school.

C. Transport Policy

D. Discontinuation of Services

• If you wish to discontinue transportation services, it is mandatory to complete the Discontinuation Form. For further details, please contact the Transport Department.

E. Early Pickup Request

• If a parent intends to pick up a child early from school, a prior email must be sent to <u>info@woodlemparkhamidiya.ae</u>, the respective head of section, and the respective class teacher to ensure the request is processed smoothly.

Guidelines For Own Transportation

- Arrival & Pick-up: Children using their own transportation must report to school by 7:30 a.m. at Gate No. 6. For pickup, students should be collected at 2:15 p.m. from Gate No. 6.
- Home Alone Pass: Students in Grade 3 to 7 can get a Home Alone pass allowing them to leave class and/or school premises without an adult. If you wish your child to have a 'Home Alone Pass' and leave their classroom by themselves, kindly contact info@woodlemparkhamidiya.ae
